# V. Financial Report

Finance Director Leslie Zander stated there is nothing outstanding about this month's report. Chairman Vernon stated the sales tax is \$3,628 above last year. Total sales tax for the year is \$2,093,186 which is outstanding.

# VI. Eastland Economic Development Inc. Bi-Annual Report – Tom Bailey

Eastland Economic Development Executive Director Tom Bailey shared a slide presentation with the Commissioners and the audience.

He stated that Eastland continues to grow economically. Many opportunities have been taken advantage of in the last year. He highlighted just a few:

EEDI has just over 100 acres in the business park with several business already occupying it. One of these is Bartee Metals. They have a "Fabrication Shop" that fabricates metal buildings from the Red Iron Beams to the metal building. This has been a very successful partnership with EEDI supplying the funds for the initial building and Bartee Metals leasing to own.

EEDI also has 26 acres near the Eastland Airport that are available for development. They are currently advertising and anticipating business that are affiliated with the air traffic industry.

Nicholas Petroff is a developer who is developing the old "Stanley Ford/Sale Barn" property on East Main Street. He is looking forward to bringing in many businesses and opening that area as another egress to Wal-Mart. This is still in the early stages but is very exciting.

Mr. Petroff is also developing the "Old Rip" Addition which is neighborhood behind the Eastland County Crisis Center. This will have approximately 49 residences as well as the Eastland County Appraisal District.

EEDI recently participated in the Chamber of Commerce ribbon cutting for Veterans Garage Doors at 1415 E. Main Street. This is a company that manufactures garage doors and carports. It has stores in Weatherford and Abilene. EEDI provided assistance in getting the garage doors stocked here as well organizing the garage door openers, parts and displays. All of this helps with the manufacturing and installation of garage doors.

Mr. Bailey stated an immediate creation of at least three jobs here in Eastland and they are hoping to expand to five or six employees here in Eastland by the end of the year.

Overall, this has been a great year for Economic Development in Eastland and we are looking forward to continuing success. Mr. Bailey thanked the City of Eastland for its continued partnership and commitment to the future.

This is a triangular piece of property adjacent to the LaQuinta Inn. It is owned by the same people who own the LaQuinta.

**Request:** To Rezone Parcel to just C2-Commercial for development

**Staff Report:** When zoning was placed on this area in 2007, there was an issue where zoning was mapped incomplete as one or the other. Rezoning the property will allow for uniform zoning across the entire lot and allow for commercial development for a possible restaurant in the near future on this property.

**<u>Staff Recommendation</u>**: To approve the rezoning of property to C2 – Commercial for further development of area by property owners.

Planning Director Tony Stubblefield stated that when the EEDI Board deeded this property to the City of Eastland, we did not realize we had to designate it as a public Right-of-Way. This resolution will officially make Terri Street, between Dollar General and the Old Tractor Supply Building, a public Right-of-Way.

### **GLO-CDBG-MIT Project Planning**

The bids for the streets have been approved and the contracts are under review at this time. The contract review should be complete soon.

The bid packet for the south fork of the Leon River clearing is being completed. The packet should be ready by November to bid.

The north fork of the Leon River clearing is complete.

# X. Code Compliance Report

Planning and Zoning Director Tony Stubblefield reported the Code Compliance Report for August 2024. There were 62 open cases at the beginning of the month, 15 new cases were opened and 22 case were closed, which ended the month with 55 cases open. One citation was issued: for Off street parking, Parking in front or exterior side yar, Recreational vehicle use. (Repeat)

# **XI.** Police Chief Report

Chief Tim Pitts stated there were 366 calls for service in August. 25 cases were filed with the District Attorney and 0 cases filed with the Juvenile Authorities. There were 61 offense reports generated. He noted 13 arrests. A total of 603 traffic stops were initiated. This resulted in 405 warning citations and 198 citations issued. He also stated that 685 "business checks" were conducted. Our Animal Control Officer had a very active month with 70 business calls. 24 animals were impounded and 7 were adopted and 1 was quarantined. 0 citations and 5 warnings were issued by the Animal Control Officer.

Chief Pitts noted there was 1 Narcotics Arrest; 4 arrest warrants served;

Chief Pitts and the department participated in the recent Job Fair which was hosted by the West Central Texas Council of Governments.

Chief Pitts and County Judge David Hullum provided Active Shooter training for the faculty at Ranger College.

#### XII. Fire Chief Report

Fire Chief Joe Williamson gave the following activity report for the month of August 2024 for the Volunteer and Paid Firefighters. Total call volume: 119 which was an average of 3.8 calls per day. 94 of these were in the City Limits and 23 of them were in the county and they responded to 2 calls for mutual aid to other county fire departments. There were 13 incidents between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. There was 1 structure fire, 1 grass fire and 1 vehicle fire. They responded to 66 Medical calls, 16 Motor Vehicle accidents and 16 Public Service assists and 4 false alarm/investigations. We had two rescues. Our volunteer membership remains at 25. However, we have 4 applications pending.

We are working towards an inspection scheduled in 2025 that will increase our ISO rating for insurance.

We have completed our first TCFP class. We have our annual open house scheduled for October 12, 2024.

Chief Williamson spoke with a representative from TxDOT who informed him that the traffic control device for the Fire Department on South Seaman has been approved and they are just awaiting installation. This device can be turned on when a fire truck is leaving or returning to the station to help control traffic.

We are now at full staff. Welcome to Firefighter Joshua Dangel who began work with us on September 9, 2024.

And finally, thanks to the rain filling up the lake and water restrictions being lifted, we have washed our fire apparatus for the first time since August 22, 2023.
